> Report: Fine Arts Workshop (1 to 29 October, 2025)

Under the guidance of Principal Dr. Jasvir Singh, a month-long Fine Arts Workshop was successfully organized under the Indian Knowledge System (IKS) framework at Sri Guru Teg Bahadur Khalsa College, Sri Anandpur Sahib. The workshop aimed to celebrate India's artistic heritage and encourage students to explore indigenous creative practices through hands-on learning.
